Advanced Health Assessment & Diagnostic Measurement (Spring 1999-2004)

This course provides advanced assessment skill required for advanced nursing practice with an emphasis on development of comprehensive and problem specific psychosocial, development, cultural and epidemiological client centered databases. Course assures students ability to assess through a client’s life span. Strategies to identified “abnormal” versus “variations of normal” are emphasized. Based on physical assessment data, students are taught means to determine client health status, identify health problems, and formulate diagnoses. The determination of psychomotor, development, cultural, nutritional, mental status in addition, physical health status in a clinical setting is provided under the guidance and supervision of a faculty facilitator. 56 hours with 120 hours practical experience

Primary Care in Community Health/Public Health

Nursing II: Chronic Care (Spring 2000-2004, 2011-2015)

The study of chronic disorders seen in primary care practice with attention to major public health concepts/therapies required in the development, implementation, and evaluation of primary health care. Clinical practice focus: application of nursing theory, pathophysiology epidemiology, assessment, diagnosis, pharmaceutical and non pharmaceutical treatment and other essential primary care skills: assuring health promotion, protection, maintenance, restoration, and disease progression prevention. 80 hours lecture/ 120 hours practical experience

Care of Children and Adolescents (Spring 2004-2004, 2011-2015)

This study of assessment, diagnosis, management, and education of children and youth at various stages with common acute and chronic health problems: Systematic appraisal of physical, social, development, family, and parenting skills are utilized in clinical management. Health promotion, nutrition, and education are emphasized. Evaluation strategies are employed to analyze ethical and legal situations. Clinical problems are analyzed and interpreted using an epidemiological approach to patient care management.80 hours lecture/120 hours practical experience

Primary Care 1: Adults (2015- present) (NURS 7710)

This course is the first primary care course in a series of four courses, builds on skills and knowledge learned in earlier courses and focuses on the study of adult disorders managed in primary care practice. Emphasis is on the integration of major community health concepts and therapies required in the development, implementation and evaluation of primary health care. Students apply nursing concepts, theories, diagnoses, therapies, skills and techniques to provide care to adults in various community health settings. Provide clinical preceptors with in this course and guest lecturers on topics of hematology.

Primary Care 1: Family Across the Lifespan (2015- present) (NURS 7710)

This course addresses health issues that may occur across the lifespan and, builds on advanced nursing practice principles to provide the knowledge, concepts, skills and abilities needed to promote and manage the health of patients across the lifespan. It focuses on the study of the development and health of individual members of the family unit and relates theories and concepts as they apply to individual members of the family. Emphasis is on the integration of major health concepts and evidence based therapies required in the development, implementation and evaluation of gender specific primary health care. Students apply nursing concepts, theories, diagnoses, therapies, skills and techniques to provide care to infants, children and adults in various community health settings. Provide clinical preceptors with in this course and guest lecturers on topics of required.

Primary Care 1: Vulnerable Populations (2015- present) (NURS 7710)

This is the third primary care course in a series of four courses and builds on previously learned principles and skills, focusing on the study of primary care management of health conditions and disparities experienced by vulnerable individuals and groups. Emphasis is on the integration of major health concepts and evidence based therapies required in the development, implementation and evaluation of specific primary health care strategies. Students apply nursing concepts, theories, diagnoses, therapies, skills and techniques to provide care to vulnerable groups or individuals in various community health settings. Provide clinical preceptors with in this course and guest lecturers on topics of infectious disease

Tulane University, Department of Cell and Molecular Biology, Guest Lecturer*Cell and Molecular Biology 600 (CMB 600) (Spring 2003-2005)*

Developed/presented 3 hour lecture addressing Bioethical issues commonly occurring during the provision of HIV prevention, diagnosis and treatment.

Delgado Community College, Physical Therapist Assistant Program, Guest Lecturer*Pathophysiological Conditions (PTAP 204) (Fall 1997-)*
