

Student to Teacher Ratio




Are you looking for a place that will know your name and not treat you just like another number? That's exactly what you'll get at the LSU School of Public Health.

In order to qualify for a scholarship, you need to be applying with a begin date in the Fall as scholarships are not awarded to those beginning in the Spring and Summer semesters. Primary consideration for scholarships are given to applicants who apply to the Fall semester by February 1st.

Where Students Are Coming From

While the vast majority of our students come from right here in Louisiana, they in no way make up the entirety of the student population at the LSU School of Public Health. Between 2018-2020, we've had students from 14 states and 5 international countries, including China, the Ukraine and Saudi Arabia.
