
LSU School of Public Health's Mission

With a population that reflects that of the state of Louisiana, we are training the next generation of Public Health workers in a way that reflects the community we call home.


Student - Teacher Ratio

Health Policy and Systems Management

The program in Health Policy and Systems Management (HPSM) is concerned with personal and population health improvement through planning, implementation and operation of systemic, effective and community responsive programs and organizations. The HPSM program prepares students for managerial, consulting, and leadership roles in public health and health care organizations.



Program core courses also prepare students to pursue careers to develop and advocate for health policies to achieve cost-effective delivery of health services as well as to ensure desired health outcomes.

Admission Requirements

- A baccalaureate degree for MPH from an accredited college or university
- A suggested grade point average of 3.0 for undergraduate and graduate work based on a 4point scale
- Official Graduate Record Exam (GRE) or Medical College Admission Test (MCAT) score may be submitted but is not required for MPH.
- Satisfactory standing at the most recent educational institution attended

Scholarships

The School of Public Health and the HPSM program make scholarships available for incoming Master-level students as funding permits. These are competitive based on admission information and currently require fall application to be considered.
