TEACHING EXPERIENCE/RESPONSIBILITIES:

I have been involved with teaching since becoming an instructor at the LSUHSC-New Orleans School of Public Health in 2001. I was integrally involved with the development of courses for the MPH program. In 2004, I developed and taught the first offering of the Monitoring and Evaluation course for the school.

The Louisiana Comprehensive Cancer Control Program, which I direct, has had a continuing education program for healthcare professionals since 2006. My work includes developing the content and learning objectives for the continuing education program.

In 2006, I began coordinating the practice experience for the Behavioral and Community Health Sciences program and participated with the interdisciplinary group that oversaw the course. My contributions include working with students and preceptors on course objectives and evaluating student performance. In 2008, this responsibility expanded to include the practice experience for the Epidemiology program. In 2010, the Practice Experience (PUBH 6800) became a school-wide offering and I assumed leadership as the course director. I further refined the requirements for and objectives of the course until relinquishing duties at the end of 2013. In 2017, I resumed responsibility for PUBH 6800 and refined the course requirements to meet competency-based accreditation requirements introduced by the Council on Education for Public Health.

In 2009, I co-taught the course on community-based participatory projects for the Behavioral and Community Health Sciences Program.

In 2010, I began teaching Behavioral Health Theories in Public Health (BCHS 6212), a core course for all public health master's degree students. I currently teach BCHS 6212 in the Fall semester. I work closely with the instructor for the Summer offering to ensure all students are exposed to the same material and come away with the same competencies. It is my intent to teach students the required behavioral health materials associated with the National Board of Public Health Examiners' public health certification exam. This course is also a useful venue for doctoral students completing their teaching practicum; I assist them in developing and delivering lectures in the course.

In 2021, began preparing the BSPH 4100, Public Health in Action Course. This will be an online course for the Bachelors in Public Health program. The course is offered summer and spring beginning 2022.
